Staff at Milldale Centre who are talented gardeners will provide ongoing supervision of the project and where appropriate skilled staff will be engaged to fulfil the tasks where more experience is required. The provision of such therapy is cost effective in that it provides for all 80 adults attending Milldale on an ongoing basis throughout the year and complements rather than duplicates the services provided by Renfrewshire Council.
