**Applications for Local Partnership Funding to Gleniffer  
Local Partnership 2023/24**

**1. Summary**

- 1.1 Applications for grant funding from the seven Local Partnership areas were invited to be submitted during March and April 2023, to be considered at the Local Partnership meetings due to be held in May 2023.
- 1.2 The total funding allocation for Gleniffer Local Partnership for 2023/24 is £53,264. This is made up of £53,264 from the General Fund and £10,200 from Paisley Common Good Fund.
- 1.3 From this total budget, a sum of £50 per community representative requires to be ringfenced for potential claim of expenses. These expenses are deducted from the available allocation for the Local Partnership. Gleniffer Local Partnership has space for seven community members, so the total ringfenced for expenses is £350. **The total budget available for allocation by Gleniffer Local Partnership is therefore £52,914.**
- 1.4 The total value of applications to the Gleniffer Local Partnership meeting on 25 May 2023 is £98,839.88.
- 1.5 The Youth Challenge Fund component of Gleniffer Local Partnership Funding for 2023/24 is £19,861. This funding will be allocated by young people through a Participatory Budgeting exercise that will take place during April and May 2023, with decisions to be announced in June 2023.

## 2. **Recommendations**

- 2.1 It is recommended that members of Gleniffer Local Partnership consider the applications for Local Partnership grant funding, as set out below in Appendix 1 and 2.

## 3. **Background**

- 3.1 Applicants for funding in 2023/24 have been provided with guidance, as well as a description of the Local Priorities identified by Gleniffer Local Partnership.
- 3.2 Local Partnership members are asked to consider the applications for funding summarised at Appendix 1 and 2 of this report, and to assess these against the Local Priorities agreed by the Gleniffer Local Partnership.
- 3.3 An initial assessment has been carried out by officers to support Local Partnership members in their decision-making. Where applications have made clear reference to the Local Priorities identified by the Local Partnership, this is identified in the first table at Appendix 1. Applications that make a partial or no reference to Gleniffer Local Priorities are summarised in the second table – for example, the project supports tackling loneliness and isolation (and therefore meets the Local Priority around loneliness and isolation) but does not deliver this directly in the Local Partnership area or make reference to how many people from the area would be engaged in the project.
- 3.4 The priorities of Gleniffer Local Partnership are:

### **Community assets**

The Local Partnership want to see busy local community centres, full of activities. They also want to boost community involvement, getting more people involved in local groups and volunteering.

### **What's on in Foxbar, Brediland and Glenburn**

The Local Partnership want to develop ways to share information about what is going on locally across the area, including developing community noticeboards and networks.

### **Public safety and road safety**

The Local Partnership want to promote public safety across the area. This includes road safety and managing the speed of traffic in the area.

### **Isolation and loneliness**

The Local Partnership want to tackle isolation and loneliness across the area. They think a key barrier for some people is transport and being able to access activities.

**Play facilities**

The Local Partnership want to see development of parks and play areas for children and young people.

<b>Purpose of the project</b> Our purpose is to bring adults with learning disabilities together to build and strengthen social connections and to reduce social isolation to help improve the mental health and wellbeing of our members. We aim to get more people involved in their local communities, and to feel valued and active participants in these communities. We want to give our members the confidence to travel independently across Renfrewshire, and to become more visible in mainstream venues and therefore more confident and more accepted by the rest of society. SCLD's report on relationships in 2020 noted that only 5% of adults with learning disabilities lived with a partner, as compared with 56% of the general population. And only 3% were married as against 47% of the general population. Traditionally adults with learning disabilities have been discouraged from forming friendships and relationships, and the subject of sex is totally taboo. Dates-n-Mates was developed to give our members the opportunity to have the same social experiences as the rest of the adult population.	
<b>What will the project do?</b> We run a monthly programme of events in mainstream venues across Renfrewshire to give our members the opportunity to meet new people, make friends and build lasting meaningful relationships. We also provide workshops around confidence building, self-esteem and sexual health, to equip our members with the knowledge they need to take control of their own lives and be responsible for their own actions. We offer a Friendship Matching Programme so members can meet on a more personal level to forge a stronger connection, based on similar interests.

Dates-n-Mates is a dating and friendship agency run by and for adults with learning disabilities.
