Energy Efficiency in Scotland

- Make our homes warmer and places of work more comfortable
- Promote more affordable energy for consumers
- Help to tackle fuel poverty
- Improve competitiveness of the Scottish economy and generate substantial market opportunities
- Create a green economy
- Contribute to meeting our climate change targets



Council Workstreams and Programmes

- Energy Efficiency Standards for Social Housing
 - mandatory minimum standard for the energy efficiency rating of various property types for social landlord's properties in Scotland
- Home Energy Efficiency Programme for Scotland:
 Area Based Scheme
 - grant funding mechanism (funded by the Scottish Government and administered by Councils) to enable private householders to have certain energy efficiency measures installed
- Scotland's Energy Efficiency Programme
 - intended to succeed the HEEPS:ABS programme. Will likely encourage or require the combination of domestic and non-domestic properties, potentially within both the public and private sector, in single projects

- Optimisation systems



Framework Management

- In addition to usual robust contract management activities undertaken by Scotland Excel, a number of specific activities will be undertaken reflective of the nature of this critical framework
 - Advice on incorporation of council grant funding and external funding sourced by the contractor.
 - Application of the Regulated Procurement Regime
 - Track and report on funding streams
 - KPI measures including carbon savings, SAP (Standard Assessment Procedure) point gains and EESSH compliance
 - Tracking works undertaken against realised benefits, including community benefits
