Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan Priorities

The Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan has been developed to set out the priorities and objectives within Renfrewshire and allows our local authority partners to scrutinise the performance outcomes of these priorities. We will continue to work closely with our partners in Renfrewshire to ensure we are all **"Working Together for a Safer Scotland**" through targeting risks to our communities at a local level.

The plan has been developed to complement key partnership activity embedded across Renfrewshire Community Plan and associated Delivery and Thematic plans. Through partnership working we will seek to deliver continuous improvement in our performance and effective service delivery in our area of operations.

The Local Fire and Rescue Plan for Renfrewshire identified six areas for demand reduction and is subject to regular monitoring and reporting through the Police / Fire and Rescue Committee. A summary of the priorities and current activity is detailed below with further detail and analysis contained within this performance report.

About the statistics within this report



Activity levels have reduced by up to 5%


Activity levels have increased overall






Activity by Time of Day








Domestic Safety - Accidental Dwelling Fires



Accidental Dwelling Fires show an increase of 26% (7 incidents) from Q2 2019/20. Cooking remains the most common source of ignition within Renfrewshire accounting for 19 of the accidental dwelling fires. 38% (13) of the incidents required no firefighting action, 29% (10) were due to distraction and 18% (6) were due to alcohol/drug impairment. 23 of the 34 incidents had detection installed and 18 of them operated and raised the alarm.


Domestic Safety - Accidental Dwelling Fire Casualties




A decrease of 50% from 2 to 1 dwelling fire casualties for this reporting period. and a 36% decrease over the 3-year period average for this performance indicator. This period sees a return to a more normal trend versus the increase we seen in the Q1 report due to the 3 significant incidents encountered in Q1 in Renfrewshire.

The injury sustained during this quarter was minor in nature.


Unintentional Injury and Harm



Non-fire casualties show a decrease of 27% year on year from 26 to 19. Of the 19 casualties 8 were a result of a Road Traffic Collision. 26% (5) incidents were Assisting Other Agencies. No Fatalities are recorded this quarter and of the injuries encountered 3 were regarded as serious.

Q2 last year. Secondary fires accounted for 80% (86) of the incidents within this indicator. Refuse fires continues to be the main area of activity within this metric.

Definitions

All Incidents

Primary Fires - all fires in buildings, vehicles and outdoor structures or any fire involving casualties, rescues or fires attended by five or more appliances Secondary Fires - fire incidents that did not occur at a primary location, was not a chimney fire in an occupied building, did not involve casualties (otherwise categorised as a primary incident) and was attended by four or fewer appliances.






A decrease of 50% (10 incidents) for the year on year measure. 4 incidents required no firefighting action and 4 incidents resulted in No Fire Damage.

The main types of premises affected were Single shops with 2 incidents and Other Residential/Student Hall of residence with 2 incidents.

Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals



Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals (UFAS) show a 32% (93 incidents) reduction year on year. Similar to Q1 this can partly be attributed to the COVID 19 restrictions in place. 13% (26 incidents) were recorded in residential Care homes. Hospitals and Medical Care Premises accounted for 11% (22 incidents). 43% (85 incidents) were found to be as a result of Human interactions i.e. not isolating the system before testing, cooking, smoking, accidentally/carelessly set off.
