(Please use a separate sheet if required) | 2.3 2.9 | <p>To enhance the school grounds to make it a more welcoming environment for our pupils and their parents. Currently 54% of S1-3 pupils eat lunch outside of the school, with a much higher percentage in S4-6. The school has large grounds with no facilities beyond seating for 12 pupils. Based on pupil feedback 90% are likely to stay on school grounds if they had somewhere to socialise and the environment was improved. The project can be completed in stages and we are happy to accept a smaller amount of money than requested if you see fit (please see below.) The parent council identified the need for some renovation to our school grounds and a separate fundraising sub group was formed to drive this project forward. The school pupils have been consulted and they have the following priorities for the school grounds: 58% - more seating, 20% - sports court, 15% - Redecoration, 5% - Garden. As part of the recent HMIE inspection, it was highlighted that our school should focus on Health & Wellbeing and Learning & Teaching. Improved school grounds and a higher number of pupils staying for lunch would help remedy this (see below for details.) The project will increase the pupil numbers staying in school at breaks by providing better facilities for them. The access to sports facilities will improve health and wellbeing of the pupils. Improved school grounds will foster a sense of pride in the school in our pupils and local community. More pupils staying in school during lunch breaks and a better impression of the school by pupils and local community.
