Membership of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership

1. Summary

1.1 The purpose of this paper is to invite standing members of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership to agree the appointment of community representatives to vacant positions within the Local Partnership.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that standing members of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership:
- (a) Consider the summary of applications received in relation to the places for community representatives on the Local Partnership which require to be filled, as set out at paragraph 3.3 and;
- (b) Discuss and agree those applicants which members of the Local Partnership wish to appoint to fill the vacant community representative positions on the Local Partnership.

3. **Background**

- 3.1 The first meeting of the Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership held on 29 January 2019 agreed community representatives to fill eight of the nine remaining spaces. The intention was that the remaining space would be taken up by a young person's representative if possible.
- 3.2 Criteria have been developed to support members to come to a decision on the appointment of community representatives. These were set out as part of the application and are as follows:
 - Size of the community the group represents.
 - Mechanisms in place to communicate with the local community.

- Whether a group represents or support a community of interest and how connected the group is to other community groups in the area.
- 3.3 Four organisations have expressed an interest in providing a community representative. The applications are:

Declarations of Interest

Councillor Cameron declared a non-financial interest in item 1 on the agenda as she was a member Kairos, one of the groups nominating a representative to the Local Partnership. She intimated that she would remain in the meeting but would not take part in the discussion and decision on the application.

1 Membership of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership

There was submitted a report by the Chief Executive relative to the appointment of community representative to vacant positions within the Local Partnership.

The report advised that in terms of the decision taken at the meeting of the Council held on 27 September 2018 membership of each Local Partnership would comprise of an equal number of elected members from Renfrewshire Council and community representatives, with the standing members being those elected members who represented wards within the Local Partnership area and representatives of active community councils in the area. The report listed eleven elected members who were eligible for membership together with the representatives for Johnstone and Linwood Community Council, being the only two active community councils in the area.

Details of eight applicants who had expressed an interest in providing a community representative to sit on this Local Partnership were listed within the report. Criteria to support standing members to determine the appointment of community representatives was also provided, together with information about the two additional applications for membership not included within the report.

It was further proposed that the remaining place be filled by a youth representative. Applications from youth representatives would actively be pursued by Chief Executive's Department. This was agreed unanimously.

DECIDED:

- (a) That Margaret Lavery (Quarrelton Area Tenants and Residents Association); Laura Graham (Linwood Scout Group); Adele Fraser (Linstone Housing Association); Lesley Compston (KLAS Care); Jackie Armour (KAIROS); Iain McMillan (Johnstone Community Sports Complex); Margaret Johnston (Johnstone Business Consortium); and Ricky Kelly (Johnstone Castle Tenants and Residents Association) be appointed to the Local Partnership and;
- (b) That the final vacant place be kept available in the first instance for a youth representative.

2 Date of Next Meeting

It was noted that the next meeting would be held in March 2019 on a date and time to be advised as soon as possible.

It was proposed that meetings of this Local Partnership be held at venues within the local community and that the meetings be held in the evenings. This was agreed.







As recorded by the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation





SIMD 2016 - Access Deprivation




Access Deprivation

This measure includes drive time to GP, to retail centre, to petrol station, to primary and secondary schools, to post office and public transport time to GP, to retail centre, to post office.




Health Deprivation

This measure includes the Standardised Mortality Ratio; Hospital stays related to alcohol misuse; Hospital stays related to drug misuse; Comparative Illness Factor; Emergency stays in hospital; Proportion of population being prescribed drugs for anxiety, depression or psychosis; and Proportion of live singleton births of low birth weight.



Crime Deprivation

This measure includes Domestic house breaking, Drug offences, Common assault, Crimes of violence, Vandalism and Sexual offences.



Place Standard, 2017

47 residents from Linwood and Johnstone Local Partnership area responded to Our Renfrewshire, Place Standard Consultation in 2017. 70% of the respondents were female, 30% were male, with most respondents of working age.

TITLE:

Local Partnership – Future Arrangements

1. Summary

- 1.1 Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership requires to take a number of decisions about its operation over the next year.
- 1.2 These decisions relate to the arrangements for meetings and the name the Local Partnership wishes to be known by. Members of the Local Partnership are invited to contribute to these decisions as set out in section 3 below.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership:
 - (a) Agree that three further meetings of the Local Partnership be held in June 2019, November 2019 and March/April 2020 with a wider community engagement event to take place during September/October 2019, as set out in paragraphs 3.1 3.3.
 - (b) Agree that members of the Local Partnership contribute their views on accessible venues for future meetings, as set out in paragraph 3.4.
 - (c) Agree that members of the Local Partnership contribute suggestions for its name going forward as set out in paragraphs 3.5-3.6, for decision at next meeting on Tuesday 4 June 2019.
 - (d) Note the arrangements for Community Representative expenses, as set out in paragraph 3.7.

3. Background

- 3.1 Local Partnerships will meet a minimum of three times per year. The next meeting of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership will take place at 6pm on Tuesday 4 June 2019, venue to be confirmed.
- 3.2 It is proposed that each Local Partnership sets two further dates to meet in November 2019 and March/April 2020 and that the start time for meetings be agreed as 6pm.
- 3.3 In addition to the three Local Partnership meetings per annum it is proposed that a community event be organised to enable engagement with community groups, voluntary organisations and members of the public who are not members of the Partnership.
- 3.4 Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership is asked to consider whether it would prefer a single venue for all meetings or to alternate between different venues within the Local Partnership area. Members are asked to send any suggestions for accessible local venues to communityplanning@renfrewshire.gov.uk by Tuesday 7 May 2019.
- 3.5 Each of the seven Local Partnerships consist of groupings of Community Councils. The name currently being used for the Local Partnership is simply a list of the names of each Community Council in the area.
- 3.6 Each Local Partnership may choose its own name, by agreeing either to continue with its current name or changing to an alternative name. Proposals for an alternative name should be submitted to communityplanning@renfrewshire.gov.uk by Tuesday 7 May 2019 for consideration and decision at the meeting of the Local Partnership.
- 3.7 Under the previous Local Area Committee arrangements, community representatives were entitled to £50 per annum expenses to attend meetings. Members of the Local Partnership may continue to claim £50 per annum expenses for attendance at meetings. This resource would be drawn from the Local Partnership grant funding allocation as was the case previously under Local Area Committee arrangements.
