**Heading:** Traffic Signals Planned and Unplanned Inspection and Maintenance

# 1. Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek the approval of the Finance,
  Resources and Customer Services Policy to award a contract for Traffic
  Signals Planned and Unplanned Inspection and Maintenance,
  reference RC-CPU-22-342, to Swarco UK & Ireland Ltd.
- 1.2 The tendering procedure for this Services Contract followed the Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulations 2015 under the Open Procedure and Renfrewshire Council's Standing Orders Relating to Contracts.
- 1.3 A Contract Strategy was approved by the Head of Operations and Infrastructure (now the Head of Service for Operations and Service Development Manager) and the Strategic Commercial and Procurement Manager in June 2023.

#### 2. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Finance, Resources and Customer Services Policy Board:

- 2.1 Authorise the Head of Corporate Governance to award the Contract for Traffic Signals Planned and Unplanned Inspection and Maintenance, reference RC-CPU-22-342, to Swarco UK & Ireland Ltd.
- 2.2 Note that the intended *starting date* is 1 November 2023 with the *service period* being 24 (twenty-four) months from the *starting date* with the Council having the option, at its sole discretion, to extend the *service period* on 2 (two) occasions for a period of up to 12 (twelve) months on each occasion. The actual *starting date* will be confirmed in the Council's Letter of Acceptance.
- 2.3 Note that the cumulative spend under this Contract will be up to a maximum value of £3,000,000 excluding VAT.

## 3. **Background**

- 3.1 Renfrewshire Council has a statutory obligation to maintain and approve all traffic signals in operation within the Council boundary. Given this obligation, the Council has a requirement for a suitably qualified and experienced contractor to carry out the repair and maintenance work to the Council's traffic signal infrastructure and to also carry out works for improvements and new developments to this infrastructure.
- The Contract will be formed under the NEC3 Term Service Short Contract April 2013 with bespoke Z Clauses.
- 3.3 The Contract was tendered using the Public Contracts (Scotland)
  Regulations 2015, as amended. The contract notice was dispatched via
  the Public Contracts Scotland portal on 26 June 2023 and advertised
  on the Find a Tender Service on the same date. The tender documents
  were available for download through the Public Contracts Scotland –
  Tender portal.
- 3.4 During the tendering period, three (3) companies expressed an interest in the Contract. By the closing date set for return of electronic tenders, 12 noon on Monday, 31 July 2023, two (2) companies provided a response and one (1) failed to respond. The Tender Submissions received were evaluated by a panel comprising representatives from Environment, Housing and Infrastructure, Health and Safety, Risk and the Corporate Procurement Unit.

- 3.5 The Tenderer Submissions were evaluated against a pre-determined set of criteria in the form of the Single Procurement Document, SPD (Scotland). All Tenderers satisfied the Council's requirements in respect of their responses to the SPD (Scotland).
- The technical and commercial responses in each Tender Submission were then scored against the award criteria of 50% technical (Quality) and 50% commercial (Price).
- 3.7 The scores relative to the award criteria of the Tenderers are noted below:

- 3.8 The evaluation of Tender Submissions received identified that the submission by Swarco UK & Ireland Ltd was the most economically advantageous tender.
- 3.9 Community Benefits were requested as part of the procurement process and Swarco UK & Ireland Ltd have committed to the following Community Benefits:
