We plan to ru 15 x 3 hour workshops with talks and practical gardening tasks using potato growing in schools/community venues, and at the greenhou and raised beds at the Healthy Heart Garden. Healthy eating will be promoted by a booklet of 12 soup recipes for using potatoes and ot vegetables. This will be distributed to pupils and local groups, as we online via the website at www.retrust.org.uk. The project will work with children living within the Paisley North area to teach them who food comes from and how to care for their local environment. A wide aspect of the project activity is that people on community payback orders benefit from meaningful work making raised beds and cotton bags. It will helped to reduce vandalism to local gardens, making the area more attractive for people moving in to newly built homes and promotes maintenance of local green spaces for use by all ages. In the last 12 months, the Spuds for Buddies Phase 1) has been successful working with local schools (St. James' Primary, Mossvale Primary); a local nursery (Rainbow Nursery) and several community groups to rawareness of healthy eating and improve gardening skills in the Pais				

raised beds built with the support of Renfrewshire Community Payback Team at the Healthy Heart Garden and assisted by two volunteers, potatoes planted by 34 school pupils (P6/P7) from St. James' Primary were grown. The potatoes were successfully harvested and taken by a pupil group for use in healthy eating cookery activities at St. James Primary in June 2017. This has led to further plans for 36 raised beds to be established for growing of potatoes by 71 school pupils (P6/P7) from St. James Primary and Mossvale Primary at the Healthy Heart Garden in March 2018. Heart Garden is providing a outdoor learning space which enables the knowledge, skills and work experience to be built up by the school community, and in the long-term, helps to support food growing using their own raised beds. The project is working in partnership with the Renfrewshire Community Payback Team with 60 workers completing community service hours by building 68 raised beds for growing of potatoes and designing 100 cotton bags for school pupils. The participants have gained practical skills, which help to make the quality of life better for local children and the wider community. Outreach work has been carried out with a local nursery, Rainbow Nursery who reported vandalism to its outdoor garden area. Support has been provided to enhance their outdoor area, access a hedge pack from the Woodland Trust and up to 14 raised beds for food growing activity. The project will assist in tackling health issues within the Paisley North area by providing workshops and resources targeted at inequalities faced by particular 'high risk' groups, including people with learning disabilities. The project activity will be coordinated by a sessional worker and local volunteers with gardening skills. A series of workshops and talks will be provided to local primary schools, nurseries and community organisations to enhance the skills, knowledge and experience of people with learning disabilities/physical disabilities, as well as local school pupils and local nursery children. New learning opportunities will be developed in horticulture, the food cycle, food production, and healthy eating through workshops, talks and recipe book. It improve access to a safe outdoor learning environment, providing social space to increased physical activity within the Paisley North area. Workshops will take place at the Healthy Heart Garden, and within local school or nursery outdoor space. Community payback involvement will be supported through provision of materials/resources to participants make raised beds and cotton bags. Provision of 15 x 3-hour workshop sessions will take place with talks and practical tasks in gardening using raised beds built by Community Payback in schools/community venues, and at the Healthy Heart Garden. 50 Spuds for Buddies raised beds for growing potatoes and other vegetables made by Community Payback for schools / community venues. 50 Spuds for Buddies cotton bags produced for promoting potatoes and other vegetables will be produced by Community Payback and distributed to pupils and local groups. 100 Potato booklets with soup recipes for children and families distributed and available online via website at www.retrust.org.uk Assistance in tackling health issues by providing resources to address the health inequalities faced by particular 'high risk' groups living within the Paisley North area. 20 people with learning disabilities/physical disabilities, as well as 120 children and young people who have more

We supply light food throughout the day and a main meal at lunchtime. Heating and lighting are used as required. We support the church in the use of the hall and in particular the cost of the power used by our organisation. A few people who had come through life issues wanted to help other with similar life challenges. When the Drop In was established, food was a small part of the work done. Some of the folks who used the centre asked if food of a more substantial nature could be provided. At the same time the premises we used was undergoing redevelopment with a modern well equipped kitchen being installed. The continued development of off-ice skills (eg adults with learning difficulties carry out tasks on match nights requiring numeracy/interpersonal/organisational skills. We have a walking group which meets once a month for a short walk and new knowledge of the surrounding area, we also have nutritionist and psychotherapist on board and this is proving very helpful with a positive health improvement. We ask our members what they like doing and try to implement it where possible. We are starting a choir in the very near future and have secured a choirmaster. From these discussions and talking with other network partners we have identified that we could help the wider community if we had an evening group, this is something that we will consider with a slightly different programme.
