This will enable parents to make informed choices on how they travel and increase family physical, mental health and overall wellbeing. This pram/bike shewill help combat social isolation within this community. We also hope to assist and reduce co2 omissions within the local community.  Parents identified that their children wanted and enjoyed cycling to nursery only to find that there was no storage space for their bikes and scooters. We also identified that there was no storage for prams. This made walking to nursery a stressful experience for both children and parents. Parents are now taking the option of driving instead which is having an impact on social isolation. We discussed how beneficial storage space would be and how best we could raise funds for this.  The project to install a storage shed will give us opportunities to encourage parents to walk, cycle to nursery. We will seek to reward parents and children wh participate in our walk/cycle to nursery programme and celebrate their achievements when they have gained miles. This will allow our children to gain sense of satisfaction and how this can have an impact on how the feel. We will work with the school staff to furnish and stock the library. We will establish a lending/learning library where parents can borrow books as and when they need to. We would also aim to have a Bedtime Story Club every week where parents and carers can bring their child to have a bedtime story read.  In discussion with school staff, it was evident that some children did not have access to books at home.  Discussions with children, parents and staff on the way forward took place and it was deceided to do everything possible to enable easy access to books. We have been told from school staff that in research, it was found that 28% of young children in Renfrewshire so not have a story read to them. It was clear that we need to improve this.  We have already indentified a suitable room and have approval from the school to use the room for the library. We will work with the children and staff to choose suitable books and furniture for the room. A sustainable record keeping system will be established with guidance from community library staff. A Bedtime Story Club will be established to be staffed by school staff and volunteers. A member of staff is willing to commit to organising the club.  Children will show an increased love of reading and the bond between parent and child will be strengthened.

#### **Section 1 – Organisational Details**

#### 1.10 What are the aims of your organisation?

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining the building and retaining and expanding its availability and suitability for use for the benefit of the wider community.

At present community use exceeds congregational use by a factor of approximately five to one. The Trustees recognise that the future sustainability of this Category A-listed building is almost entirely dependent on promoting and encouraging community uses. Maintaining this landmark building and keeping it damp-free are crucial to retaining the many existing uses, accommodating and encouraging new ones and maintaining this nationally significant building.

#### Section 2 – Project Proposal

#### 2.3 What is the purpose of the project?

This project aims to replace a boiler at TCMC as a step towards securing the building for future community use and securing it as a venue for City of Culture 2021. Transferring TCMC to a non-faith basis is being progressed.

The boiler is expected to be condemned in April 2016. Without heating, the building fabric will suffer, dramatically hindering future use. This issue is of immediate concern and cannot wait until ownership is transferred.

This project seeks assistance to replace the boiler.

#### 2.4 How was the need for the project identified and developed?

Discussions have been ongoing with Renfrewshire Council and the Prince's Regeneration Trust on securing a sustainable future for this Category A-listed structure, a landmark building and significant heritage asset for Paisley and Renfrewshire.

During these general discussions, the boiler problem has escalated. It is currently leaking and is likely to fail its next inspection in April 2016. Successful repair is unlikely and a replacement is considered the most cost-effective solution. Input from the Council's Property Services backs up these statements.

A damp-free building is crucial to safeguard the building fabric and its future use and value to the wider community.

#### 2.5 What will it do and how will you do it?

TCMC will appoint, and cover the fees of, a suitably qualified and experienced consultant to examine the current boiler and recommend the most cost-effective solution. It is important to have input from a professional who is well-versed in the intricacies of historic buildings and outdated heating systems. The current boiler is the building's original system.

The consultant's report will form the basis of a tender exercise to appoint a suitable contractor for the required works. Based on the consultant's findings, the tender process will set out the necessary time-scales, specification and appropriate working methods for this Alisted building.

#### 2.6 What are the anticipated outcomes?

The immediate priority is to keep this building damp-free and therefore safe from accelerating deterioration. This is a crucial step in retaining this remarkable heritage asset. The anticipated outcomes are:

- appointment of contractor
- replacement of boiler

Achieving the above will help deliver wider social and community outcomes to residents of Paisley and Renfrewshire. The project will:

- secure TCMC's future use
- help promote Paisley's heritage and
- aid Paisley's bid for UK City of Culture 2021.
