Section 1 – Organisational Details

1.10 What are the aims of your organisation?

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining the building and retaining and expanding its availability and suitability for use for the benefit of the wider community.

At present community use exceeds congregational use by a factor of approximately five to one. The Trustees recognise that the future sustainability of this Category A-listed building is almost entirely dependent on promoting and encouraging community uses. Maintaining this landmark building and keeping it damp-free are crucial to retaining the many existing uses, accommodating and encouraging new ones and maintaining this nationally significant building.

Section 2 – Project Proposal

2.3 What is the purpose of the project?

This project aims to replace a boiler at TCMC as a step towards securing the building for future community use and securing it as a venue for City of Culture 2021. Transferring TCMC to a non-faith basis is being progressed.

The boiler is expected to be condemned in April 2016. Without heating, the building fabric will suffer, dramatically hindering future use. This issue is of immediate concern and cannot wait until ownership is transferred.

This project seeks assistance to replace the boiler.

2.4 How was the need for the project identified and developed?

Discussions have been ongoing with Renfrewshire Council and the Prince's Regeneration Trust on securing a sustainable future for this Category A-listed structure, a landmark building and significant heritage asset for Paisley and Renfrewshire.

During these general discussions, the boiler problem has escalated. It is currently leaking and is likely to fail its next inspection in April 2016. Successful repair is unlikely and a replacement is considered the most cost-effective solution. Input from the Council's Property Services backs up these statements.

A damp-free building is crucial to safeguard the building fabric and its future use and value to the wider community.

2.5 What will it do and how will you do it?

TCMC will appoint, and cover the fees of, a suitably qualified and experienced consultant to examine the current boiler and recommend the most cost-effective solution. It is important to have input from a professional who is well-versed in the intricacies of historic buildings and outdated heating systems. The current boiler is the building's original system. The consultant's report will form the basis of a tender exercise to appoint a suitable

contractor for the required works. Based on the consultant's findings, the tender process will set out the necessary time-scales, specification and appropriate working methods for this A-listed building.

2.6 What are the anticipated outcomes?

The immediate priority is to keep this building damp-free and therefore safe from accelerating deterioration. This is a crucial step in retaining this remarkable heritage asset. The anticipated outcomes are:

- appointment of contractor
- replacement of boiler

Achieving the above will help deliver wider social and community outcomes to residents of Paisley and Renfrewshire. The project will:

- secure TCMC's future use
- help promote Paisley's heritage and
- aid Paisley's bid for UK City of Culture 2021.

2.7 How will you monitor and evaluate progress towards these outcomes?

Achieving particular milestones will be a measure of both the specific and wider outcomes anticipated for this project, namely:

- having the recommended works completed;
- monitoring the number of existing and new uses;
- securing a new owner for the building and
- having TCMC included as a cultural venue in City of Culture 2021 events programme.
