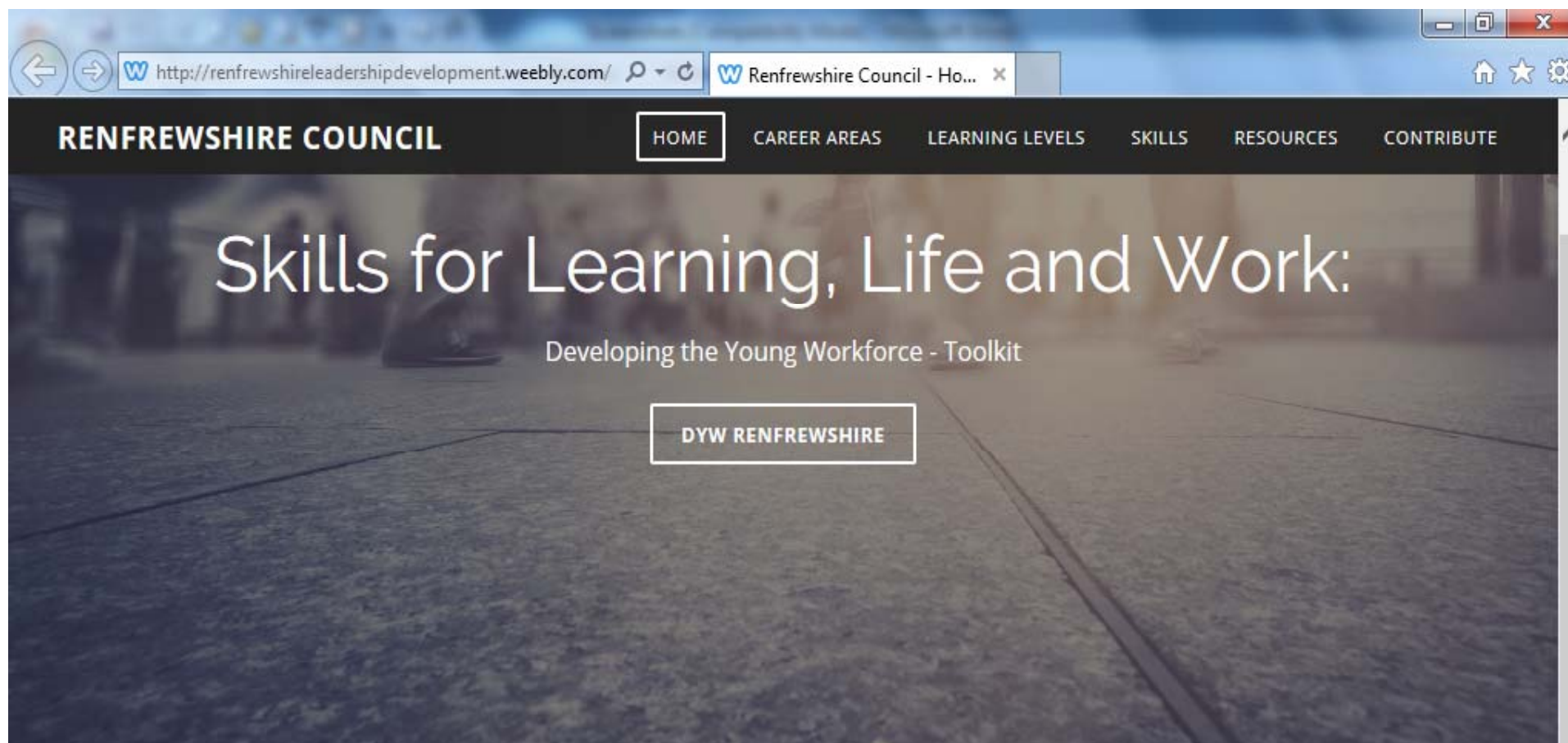

S1 pupils spend 6-9 periods completing the Inspire Aspire Global Citizenship Poster Programme. Pupils analyse their strengths and weaknesses and consider inspirational figures and quotes, before thinking about their vision for society in the future, and reflecting on what they can do to improve both themselves, and the world around them.

The powerpoint attached, clearly shows how staff help BGE pupils prepare for work by discussing their skills and qualities while encouraging each pupil to resolve to be a better person, both in school, in life in general and ultimately in the workplace. The section on values is particularly relevant to Skills for Work as it discusses the importance of attributes such as reliability and integrity.

We send 5 of the pupils' best work to Inspire-Aspire, and it is entered into their national competition.

Description

Annually we hold a World of Work Week event for the whole school to develop children's awareness of the world of work and raise their aspirations for their future.

The aims of our week are to:

- Provide information about different careers
- Raise children's awareness of the necessary skills for life, learning and work
- Give our pupils the opportunity to ask questions
- Encourage pupils to consider their future aspirations
- Develop knowledge of what an employer values
- Identify skills and qualities employers are seeking

Across our WOW week we have 43 visitors coming to our school from a wide range of occupations from a Marine engineer, Police officer, Nurse, Journalist, Occupational Therapist, Lawyer, Sales Manager for Audi and many more. (See attached timetable)

Most of our visitors will deliver a presentation to a number of classes about what their job involves, qualifications required, highlights of their job and challenges they may face. The week concludes on the Friday with a Work Cluedo event for the Primary 7 pupils where the pupils have the opportunity to ask questions to each of our 14 guests to try and guess their occupation. It helps develop their communication and questioning skills. Each class evaluates the week and each of the guests complete an evaluation form to help make any improvements for the following year. Visits are organised to local employers and businesses to allow children first-hand of experience of a business environment.
