The set up fund will be a one-off fund and will be replaced in following years by our own fundraising and business sponsorship, by membership fees, specific project funding and by ticket revenue for performances. We conducted a meeting with a range of young people and adults and looked at the things the young people wanted to do. One of which was to learn about a community which is represented locally. As a partnership was already established with the Polish Scouts we felt this was a natural link to develop. This project would also ensure young people would develop key skills which can help them in achieving outcomes with the curriculum of excellence. Local, national and international camps have proved popular with young Scouts and the difference the experience makes to them in terms of maturity and independence is always clear (a large fraction of the leader team is 18-25 and has developed through their camping experiences). Based on this experience, it was decided to run the project as an outdoor camp. We are planning an 11 day intercultural exchange to Poland. The young people will be travelling and camping in groups of seven throughout their time and this will help develop reliance, teamwork and become more confident individuals.
