Heading: Continued Grant Applications

1. Summary

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide some further details in relation to the continued applications by Anchor Bowling Club, Friends of Barshaw Park, Twist and Hit Cheerleaders and Storm Gymnastics.

2. Recommendations

2.1 The LAC is requested consider the additional information in relation to the four applications for grant funding that were continued at the meeting held on 24 May 2018.

3. Background

3.1 The Paisley North LAC continued three applications at its meeting held on 24 May 2018. Copies of the application summary sheets for each application are appended to this report.

3.2 Anchor Bowling Club

3.2.1 The Bowling Club had applied for £10,000 to repair banking which had collapsed on one of the greens. Consideration of the application was continued but no allocation of funding was ringfenced. Insufficient funds remain to make a meaningful award to the application and it is recommended that the LAC further continues consideration to such time as additional resources become available.

3.3 Friends of Barshaw Park

- 3.3.1 The Friends of Barshaw Park applied for £10,000 for a horticultural consultation; trees, plants, shrubs, bulbs and compost; container, security, fixtures and solar panels; garden tools; a gazebo and folding tables; transport and fuel costs; and a promotional event. The application was continued, with the £10,000 ringfenced, to clarify the requirement for the group to obtain planning permission for the storage container and to allow the group to look at other funding options to maximise grant funding opportunities.
- 3.3.2 Council officers continue to work with the group to identify alternative means to achieve the objectives of the application, including the provision of storage, horticultural advice and renovations to the walled garden area. It is recommended that the LAC notes these continuing efforts by officers and agree that the award of up to £10,000 be made and drawn down as required by the group and to the satisfaction of the supervising officer.

3.4 Twist and Hit Cheerleaders

- 3.4.1 The group had applied for £4,490 from the Paisley North and Paisley South LACs to help pay for repairs to the sprung dance floor. The application was continued by this LAC, with its share of £2,245 ringfenced. The LAC continued the current application to ascertain what warranties or guarantees had been put in place when the sprung floor was installed last year.
- 3.4.2 The group had applied for funding of £10,000 in 2017 for the installation of the sprung floor and were awarded a total of £6,535. The group has advised that it purchased the items required to build the floor with the assistance of a joiner as it did not get the full funding to purchase one pre-made. Therefore there was no warranty and any repairs were the responsibility of the group. Since building the floor last year the cheerleading group has intimated that it had many issues with split/cracked plywood and every time this happened the whole board and any broken springs have had to be replaced.
- 3.4.3 The group intimated that some areas of the floor were more heavily used than others the centre of the floor is used a lot more than far back corners. This area of the floor has required a considerable amount more springs and connecting metal plates which support the board joints. It is recommended that the LAC notes the issues raised by the group and considers the release of the award ringfenced by the LAC.

3.5 Storm Gymnastics

3.5.1 The group had applied for an award of £5,239, split between all five LACs, to help pay for two large crash mats, two medium crash mats and an air track. The application was continued by this LAC, with its share of £1,047.80 ringfenced. The application summary did not contain the group's bank balance – this has been confirmed as being approximately £3,500 which will be set against the group's general running costs, including hall hire, repairs, courses and general administration. It is recommended that the LAC considers the release of the award ringfenced by the LAC.
