Prior to the commencement of the meeting, the Chair intimated that this meeting of the Local Partnership would be recorded and that the recording would be available to watch on the Council's website.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest intimated prior to commencement of the meeting.

1 MINUTE OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

There was submitted the Minute of the meeting of the Gleniffer Local Partnership held on 1 June 2021.

It was noted that S McLean has submitted a late apology for non-attendance.

DECIDED:

- (a) That the late apology be noted; and
- (b) That the Minute be approved.

2 YOUDECIDE

K Miller delivered a presentation relative to #YouDecide, a participatory budgeting exercise that gave communities a key role in deciding their priorities for environmental and physical infrastructure improvements to be undertaken throughout Renfrewshire over the next three years via a Community Investment Fund of £1.2m.

The presentation explained the #YouDecide concept and highlighted the marketing and promotional work already undertaken as a first phase to encourage communities, groups and individuals to submit their ideas for environmental improvements. A video was shown, featuring local groups and individuals, detailing how to get involved and had inspired the submission of ideas. As a result of these engagement initiatives, 11 ideas/proposals for improvements had been received for the Gleniffer area. Members were advised that, on an exceptional basis and if they had not already done so, they could now submit ideas/proposals for consideration bγ contacting kellie.miller@renfrewshire.gov.uk.

It was proposed that venues in Glenburn be considered more proactively for future engagement activities. This was agreed.

The second phase of #YouDecide was underway and would conclude at the end of January 2022 with a shortlist of projects that were suitable and feasible having undergone technical assessment against set criteria. During the third and final phase of #YouDecide, communities would be invited to vote on which shortlisted project they wished to see proceed. It was anticipated that the winning projects would be announced week commencing 14 March 2022.

The proximity of a period of purdah prior to the forthcoming local government elections and its impact on timescales for completion of #YouDecide was noted.

DECIDED:

- (a) That the presentation and the proximity of a period of purdah prior to the forthcoming local government elections be noted;
- (b) That, on an exceptional basis, members who had not already done so contact kellie.miller@renfrewshire.gov.uk as soon as possible to submit ideas/proposals; and
- (c) That venues in Glenburn be considered more proactively for future engagement activities.

3 COMMUNITIES MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING FUND

There was submitted a presentation by S Miller, Engage Renfrewshire, relative to the national Communities Mental Health & Wellbeing Fund (the Fund). The Fund aimed to promote and develop good mental health and wellbeing and to protect against the impact of distress and mental ill health in adults.

Engage Renfrewshire announced that Renfrewshire had secured an award of £509,542 from the Fund and small "grass roots" community groups and organisations with a strong community focus could now apply for funding towards projects that tackled issues such as: suicide prevention; social isolation; loneliness prevention and early intervention; and/or addressed any mental health inequalities exacerbated by the pandemic and the needs of a range of "at risk" groups locally.

Assistance was sought from the Gleniffer Local Partnership members to highlight the availability of the Fund, suggest suitable projects and to encourage applications from their own and other local groups and community organisations. It was noted that the funds required to be allocated by end of March 2022.

DECIDED:

- (a) That the presentation be noted; and
- (b) That as Engage Renfrewshire was the contact point for enquiries, applications, delivery of funds and monitoring compliance, members should contact s.miller@engagerenfrewshire.com to suggest suitable projects.

4 BUDGET MONITORING REPORT

There was submitted a report by the Chief Executive relative to the status of the budget allocated to this Partnership for disbursement to local voluntary groups and organisations from the General Fund and Celebrating Renfrewshire.

The report highlighted that £7,129.75 was available to be disbursed from the General Fund and that Celebrating Renfrewshire, the participatory budgeting exercise to deliver funding to youth groups in the area, was still underway.

After discussion, it was noted:

- That a grant application was required before awards from the General Fund could be considered;
- That low voter turnout, possibly caused by the pandemic, had delayed the award of funds to youth groups via Celebrating Renfrewshire;
- That on conclusion of the Celebrating Renfrewshire exercise, a report on the outcome be submitted to this Partnership; and
- That to disburse the remaining General Fund monies, the Partnership could identify/commission local projects and invite local voluntary groups to develop and submit suitable applications to deliver commissioned projects.
- J Duffy intimated that because of the pandemic Foxbar Scout Group had lost their usual hall hire and to continue their meetings would incur excessive hire costs for alternative accommodation.

B Martin, seconded by Councillor E Devine, proposed that as an emergency measure, Foxbar Scout Group be invited to apply immediately for funding towards their hall hire and that local groups that had received less funding than requested at the Partnership meeting in June 2021 also be invited to re-apply for any funding remaining after consideration of the anticipated application from Foxbar Scout Group. This was agreed.

DECIDED:

- (a) That it be noted that £7,129.75 remained to be disbursed this financial year;
- (b) That an application for emergency funding be invited from Foxbar Scout Group to help mitigate the increased cost of hall rental as a direct result of Covid-19;
- (c) That local groups that had received less funding than requested at the Partnership meeting in June 2021, be invited to re-apply by a deadline to be set and advised to them by Community Planning, in the knowledge that remaining funds were limited; and
- (d) That all applications received be submitted to an early meeting of Gleniffer Local Partnership to be convened for that purpose.

1 GLENIFFER LOCAL PARTNERSHIP FUNDING APPLICATIONS

There was submitted a report by the Chief Executive relative to applications for funding from the Gleniffer Local Partnership in 2021/22.

The report intimated that the available allocation for the Local Partnership following previous awards was £7,129. At the meeting of the Local Partnership held on 23 November 2022, it was agreed that a local Scout group would be invited to submit an application for funding to meet additional costs of hall hire notified. The application, set out at Appendix 1 to the report, was duly submitted.

It was also agreed that groups who received funding at the meeting held in June 2021 that was less than the full amount requested would be invited to apply for any remaining funds following consideration of the Scouts' application. There were 13 applications for additional funding submitted, as set out in Appendix 2 to the report.

Following consideration, the Local Partnership agreed that the 18th Paisley & District (Coats) Scout Group would be awarded £2,000. It was then determined that the remaining funding available, £5,129, would be split equally between the 13 applicants for additional funding, resulting in £394.53 being awarded to each group.

Applications for Local Partnership Funding to Gleniffer Local Partnership 2022/23

1. Summary

- 1.1 Applications for grant funding from the seven Local Partnership areas were invited to be submitted during March and April 2022, to be considered at the Local Partnership meetings due to be held in June 2022.
- 1.2 The available allocation for Gleniffer Local Partnership for 2022/23 is £52,804.
- 1.3 From this total budget, a sum of £50 per community representative requires to be ringfenced for potential claim of expenses. These expenses are deducted from the available allocation for the Local Partnership. Gleniffer Local Partnership has space for seven community members, so the total ringfenced for expenses is £350. **The total budget available for allocation by Gleniffer Local Partnership is therefore £52,454.**
- 1.4 The Youth Challenge Fund component of Gleniffer Local Partnership Funding for 2022/23 is £19,861. This funding will be allocated by young people through a Participatory Budgeting exercise that will take place during autumn 2022.

2. Recommendations

2.1 It is recommended that members of Gleniffer Local Partnership consider the applications for Local Partnership grant funding, as set out below in Appendix 1 and 2.

3. **Background**

3.1 Applicants for funding in 2022/23 have been provided with guidance, as well as a description of the Local Priorities identified by Gleniffer Local Partnership.

- 3.2 Local Partnership members are asked to consider the applications for funding summarised at Appendix 1 and 2 of this report, and to assess these against the Local Priorities agreed by the Gleniffer Local Partnership.
- 3.3 An initial assessment has been carried out by officers to support Local Partnership members in their decision-making. Where applications have made clear reference to the Local Priorities identified by the Local Partnership, this is identified in the first table at Appendix 1. Applications that make a partial or no reference to Gleniffer Local Priorities are summarised in the second table for example, the project supports tackling loneliness and isolation (and therefore meets the Local Priority around loneliness and isolation) but does not deliver this directly in the Local Partnership area or make reference to how many people from the area would be engaged in the project.
- 3.4 The priorities of Gleniffer Local Partnership are:

Community assets

The Local Partnership want to see busy local community centres, full of activities. They also want to boost community involvement, getting more people involved in local groups and volunteering.

What's on in Foxbar, Brediland and Glenburn

The Local Partnership want to develop ways to share information about what is going on locally across the area, including developing community noticeboards and networks.

Public safety and road safety

The Local Partnership want to promote public safety across the area. This includes road safety and managing the speed of traffic in the area.

Isolation and Ioneliness

The Local Partnership want to tackle isolation and loneliness across the area. They think a key barrier for some people is transport and being able to access activities.

Play facilities

The Local Partnership want to see development of parks and play areas for children and young people.

Purpose of the project

To provide part funding of ice hire, permitting on ice activities for young persons to take place at Braehead Arena, the only facility available within a 30mile radius of Paisley. Encourage more people to watch/play a diverse sport such as ice hockey, thus promoting health from a physical & mental perspective, within the Renfrewshire wide community and surrounding areas.

On ice training & games take place in Renfrew, Braehead Arena. Paisley Pirates were first formed in 1946 & from then until the 1960's played out of East Lane. In 1992 they were resurrected at the Lagoon Leisure Centre until 2006, when Renfrewshire Leisure withdrew the ice. Due to the paucity of facilities, Pirates have gone to Dundee & Dumfries for ice. With rising demand for a skills-based approach the club has appointed a second volunteer coach & intends to appoint commensurate numbers of volunteer coaches for players under the age of 19yrs.

What will the project do?

Continue providing a local focus for the sport given no other venue is available. Continue development of on-ice skills, including off-ice skills for volunteers & adults with learning difficulties to carry out duties on game nights requiring numeracy & organisational skills. Publicise the existence of ice hockey in Renfrewshire through local media, maintaining a significant profile (the club has featured regularly in an annual project run by a Canadian tourist agency (circulation 0.25m) which promotes Paisley as an ice hockey town for tourists)

We would like to develop a drop in aimed at capacity building hard to reach minority ethnic (in particular African) communities in and around Renfrewshire which encounter multiple barriers, such as communication and those of a cultural nature, which prevent them from becoming resilient communities.
