Applications for Local Partnership Funding To Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership 2023/24

1. Summary

- 1.1 Applications for grant funding from the seven Local Partnership areas were invited to be submitted during March and April 2023, for consideration at the Local Partnership meetings due to be held in May 2023.
- 1.2 The total allocation for Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership for 2023/24 is £47,044.
- 1.3 From this total budget, a sum of £50 per community representative requires to be ringfenced for potential claim of expenses. These expenses are deducted from the available allocation for the Local Partnership. Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership has space for fourteen community members, so the total ringfenced for expenses is £700. The total budget available for allocation by Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership is therefore £46,344.
- 1.4 The total value of applications to Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership for 2023/24 is £121,094.65.
- 1.5 The Youth Challenge Fund component of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership Funding for 2023/24, known as Celebrating Renfrewshire, is £21,697. Celebrating Renfrewshire funding will be allocated by young people aged 12-25 in the Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership area through a Participatory Budgeting exercise that will take place during May 2023, with decisions to be announced in June.

2. Recommendations

2.1 It is recommended that members of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership consider the applications for Local Partnership grant funding for 2023/24, as set out below in Appendix 1 and 2.

3. Background

- 3.1 Applicants for funding in 2023/24 have been provided with guidance on the groups and type of activity that are eligible to be funded through Local Partnerships.
 Groups have also been provided with a description of the Local Priorities identified by Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership.
- 3.2 Local Partnership members are asked to consider the applications for funding summarised at Appendix 1 and 2 of this report, and to assess these against the Local Priorities agreed by Johnstone and Linwood local priorities.
- 3.3 An initial assessment has been carried out by officers to support Local Partnership members in their decision-making. Where applications have made clear reference to the Local Priorities identified by the Local Partnership, this is identified in the first table at Appendix 1. Applications that make a partial or no reference to Johnstone and Linwood Local Priorities are summarised in the second table (for example, a project that meets the criteria of benefiting young people,but isn't based in the Johnstone and Linwood area and doesn't state how many people in the area will benefit.
- 3.4 The priorities of Johnstone and Linwood Local Partnership are:

Key theme: Focus on young people

The Local Partnership are particularly keen to see a focus on how young people can be engaged and involved in work around the Local Priorities.

Taking pride in the look and feel of our towns

The Local Partnership want people in Johnstone and Linwood to take pride in the look and feel of their towns and their heritage, with vibrant and well-used town squares, fewer derelict buildings, and making sure the streets are clean.

What's on in Johnstone and Linwood

The Local Partnership want to explore how people know what's going on across Johnstone and Linwood. They also want to see community spaces and community events which are safe and affordable, particularly in community halls and hubs.

Roads and transport

The Local Partnership want to address a range of issues related to roads and transport, including congestion, speed, parking and public transport connections.

Community safety

The Local Partnership want to see safe spaces, both safe from crime but also safe physical environments. They also want to look at how they can, along with other community leaders, promote the reporting of crime and anti-social behaviour.
