(Please use a separate sheet if required)	2.3 2.9	We aim to bring Lochfield Bowling Club back to an acceptable standard of play both inside the clubhouse and outside on greens and surrounding areas. We have seen changes in the management of the clubhouse and greens and have felt powerless in trying to maintain the good reputation of the Club and the standards a public bowling green (the last fully public green in Paisley) should have. We aim to provide a welcoming atmosphere with properly maintained facilities that will encourage the existing members and the wider community to use the club on a more regular basis. At present, our facilities are barely acceptable and we hope that by bringing life back to the club we will provide an excellent community venue for people to meet and interact and also improve on exercise and mental wellbeing. We have listened to our members and the general public who have commented on their fears and dismay that this once well-established community resource has slowly been falling into disrepair and neglect. This club has in the past mentored many young bowlers and produced champion bowlers in both old and young players. Over the past few years we realised that the facilities are no longer acceptable for our members, for the public or for inviting other clubs or organisations to make use of the last fully public bowling green in the area and we set out to find a way of improving the situation. We have seen the hours when we can use the bowling green reduced and with one green in an unplayable condition we have been struggling to play our standard and competition games on the other remaining green. Only through good will and patience of all our members have we managed to struggle through this season. We felt it was vital to our community to keep the bowling green open and maintained to an acceptable standard. Not everyone wants or can afford to join private clubs (who are struggling to maintain memberships numbers). We feel we have been "making do" with unacceptable and unsafe equipment and greens for too long. We have been negotiating with Local MP, Councillors, Renfrewshire Council and Renfrewshire Sport and Leisure to look at ways of improving the	

		<p>facilities, hoping to halt the decline and encourage the wider community e.g. schools, members of the public to use this excellent community resource. The members have been working on improving the inside/outside of the clubhouse by refurbishing and replanting large containers and contacting organisations who may help in our refurbishment. New equipment in kitchen will allow members to hold Open Days for both members and public and function and socialise on a daily basis by providing tea/coffee making facilities and cold drinks. New equipment for greens will encourage members and public to play bowls in a safe and acceptable standard. Visits to other bowling venues e.g. indoor bowling, other West of Scotland venues will allow our members to continue bowling over winter season and observe how other clubs organise their facilities.</p> <p>For a long time our members and the public have been despairing and angry at the state our clubroom and greens. We realise we are not a private club and sometimes money is not available from the public purse but, as the last remaining fully public green in Paisley (with one of the biggest memberships in Paisley) we feel it is time to tackle the issues affecting us. We anticipate by improving conditions and facilities we will avoid any more members leaving and encourage the wider public to come and use the facilities. Our members will be able to relax and play bowls in a comfortable and safe environment. (Please use a separate sheet if required)	2.3 2.9	The project provides information and advice to young carers in the Renfrewshire area as well as a network of support services to young people who are carrying out caring responsibilities. This environment provides peer support and creates a sense of belonging. It is an established forum for kids to tackle issues which may be affecting them and the opportunity to be children as often their caring role mitigates the chance of a childhood. We provide one to one support as well as group support. We also provide resources to schools. We sometimes have the opportunity to have social outings which provides a little respite in an often very hectic life. The young carers project was introduced due to a demand to provide a service for a marginalised, vulnerable group of young people. It was identified that young carers, were a hidden population, lacking in non-familial supports, who were socially and emotionally isolated. It was clear that many children in the area were providing care to a relative at home and that their rights were being ignored. Research at that time was limited on the needs of young carers but what quickly became apparent at a local level was that young carers needs were not being wholly met, thus impacting on all areas of their lives. The young carers project was borne out of this need and provided a safe, secure space for young people to come and offload and to be a child! The Young Carers Centre proposes working in partnership with Renfrewshire Leisure to offer a suite of leisure opportunities for young carers to participate in. This will lessen the impact that caring can have on children; will offer activities/leisure pursuits which the young person can look forward to. It will help to create a sense of belonging for the young person, it will promote healthy activity thus positively impacting on physical and mental wellbeing. With the implementation of The Carers (Scotland) Act 2016, there is a duty on the local authority to carry out a Young Carer Statement in partnership with the young person. We are working alongside the local authority to carry out Young Carer Statements. It is	

		<p>anticipated that achieving outcomes for the young carers will involve participating in leisure activities. This will help the young person achieve their outcomes. It will give them a focus outside of their caring role and a chance at being a child first and foremost. Ability to offer young carers an opportunity to meet their desired outcomes, now enshrined in law. The suite of opportunities discussed with Renfrewshire Leisure will promote improved physical health of young carers. The demands of caring can affect both physical and mental health, it is anticipated that the introduction of participating in new activities will lessen the impact caring can have on both physical and mental health. We are inundated with referrals, especially at this time of year having provided almost 200 children with full, brand new school uniforms since 1st May 2018. We rely solely on donations from the public and local business to keep us afloat and really require significant funds at this time to ensure we can continue to fulfil the growing number of referrals that we are receiving. I am a primary teacher in Paisley and myself and colleagues see daily the children who come ill-prepared for school and the impact that this then has on their self esteem, confidence and also most importantly their learning. We decided to set up the uniform bank to service the Paisley area. We contacted local schools and local services to introduce ourselves and very quickly we were receiving referrals from across Renfrewshire. We now provide hundreds of referrals to families across the Renfrewshire Area. This project hopes to alleviate some of the financial pressure that families find themselves in when trying to provide school uniforms for their children. We source and buy new items only so as to ensure that all children feel the same sense of pride and self respect as theirs peers. We hope that with this funding we are able to continue to support the families of Renfrewshire. We would like to reach as many children as we can that need our help.
