**Applications for Local Partnership Funding to Gleniffer  
Local Partnership 2024/25**

**1. Summary**

- 1.1 Applications for grant funding from the seven Local Partnership areas were invited to be submitted during March and April 2024, to be considered at the Local Partnership meetings due to be held in May/June 2024.
- 1.2 The total funding allocation for Gleniffer Local Partnership for 2024/25 is £53,264. This is made up of £43,064 from the General Fund and £10,200 from Paisley Common Good Fund.
- 1.3 From this total budget, a sum of £50 per community representative requires to be ringfenced for potential claim of expenses. These expenses are deducted from the available allocation for the Local Partnership. Gleniffer Local Partnership has space for seven community members, so the total ringfenced for expenses is £350. **The total budget available for allocation by Gleniffer Local Partnership is therefore £52,914.**
- 1.4 The total value of applications to the Gleniffer Local Partnership meeting on 11 June 2024 is £78,817.15 .
- 1.5 The Youth Challenge Fund component of Gleniffer Local Partnership Funding for 2024/25 is £ 19,861. This funding will be allocated by young people through a Participatory Budgeting exercise that will take place during May and June 2024, with decisions to be announced in summer 2024.

## 2. **Recommendations**

2.1 It is recommended that members of Gleniffer Local Partnership consider the applications for Local Partnership grant funding, as set out below in Appendix 1 and 2.

## 3. **Background**

3.1 Applicants for funding in 2024/25 have been provided with revised guidance, as well as a description of the Local Priorities identified by Gleniffer Local Partnership.

3.2 Local Partnership members are asked to consider the applications for funding summarised at Appendix 1 and 2 of this report, and to assess these against the Local Priorities agreed by the Gleniffer Local Partnership.

3.3 An initial assessment has been carried out by officers to support Local Partnership members in their decision-making. Where applications have made clear reference to the Local Priorities identified by the Local Partnership, this is identified in the first table at Appendix 1. Applications that make a partial or no reference to Gleniffer Local Priorities are summarised in the second table – for example, the project supports tackling loneliness and isolation (and therefore meets the Local Priority around loneliness and isolation) but does not deliver this directly in the Local Partnership area or make reference to how many people from the area would be engaged in the project.

3.4 The priorities of Gleniffer Local Partnership are:

### **Community assets**

The Local Partnership want to see busy local community centres, full of activities. They also want to boost community involvement, getting more people involved in local groups and volunteering.

### **What's on in Foxbar, Brediland and Glenburn**

The Local Partnership want to develop ways to share information about what is going on locally across the area, including developing community noticeboards and networks.

### **Public safety and road safety**

The Local Partnership want to promote public safety across the area. This includes road safety and managing the speed of traffic in the area.

### **Isolation and loneliness**

The Local Partnership want to tackle isolation and loneliness across the area. They think a key barrier for some people is transport and being able to access activities.

**Play facilities**

The Local Partnership want to see development of parks and play areas for children and young people.

It's a well known fact that animals can be of huge benefit to anyone suffering from depression, stress or anxiety and our animals have helped so many people with this., Community Identity: Lamont Farm has been a part of the Erskine Community for 47 years, and is a massive part of it, and this year more than any has shown that the community is very much behind the farm staying a part of this community., Access to Services, facilities and assets: We'll be honest, we're not in the Houston Area, but we are less than a 10 minute drive away, but more to the point we take a lot of young people from the Houston Area to complete work experience, be a part of our kids clubs and more.

I myself grew up in Houston and I grew up attending Lamont Farm every weekend.
