The bouncy castle have at the moment is 10 years old and we now need to find a replacement due to wear and tear. The bouncy castle is well used and is a main feature within the youth club. The numbers attending on a Friday are significantly higher and it is mainly because this is the only night which the bouncy castle is available. Having sports activities in the hall and the bouncy castle allows us to improve the health and wellbeing of the children and young people who attend. The games also provide an opportunity for them to be involved in teams building on their skills as team players and positively influencing their peers. This fund will allow us to purchase a new bouncy castle, safety mats and sports equipment that can be used both indoors and outdoors. During the drier months we have sessions outside in the garden and play games with the children and young people. By having more up to date equipment we will be able to have more sessions outside and widen the range of the games and activities that we are able to provide.		

Over the past few months we have extended the opening hours for the Primary group. We have a total of approximately 93 children and young attending through the week. This was due to the demand for this group and the numbers attending have steadily risen through word of mouth from the children and their parents. Some of the older young people had become detached from the provision and have now returned and are keeping in touch with the staff. We also have a large group of Primary 7's transitioning to the Secondary group in August this year and a new group of children moving in to Primary 4, therefore able to attend the Primary group. The young people we work with face many issues in the community including drugs, alcohol, peer pressure and negative relationships with other adults. The youth clubs are a place for them to work through these issues and become strong members of the community that they live in. Over the past year, we have seen a significant rise in drug use in the area and this is discussed greatly by the young people. As the rise has been so great we are evaluating the role we play in educating the young people we work with in order for them to make informed decisions. The staff plays an important role in offering alternative ways to discuss these issues and offer a safe environment for them to be open and honest without being judged. The staff acknowledges that they may be one of a few positive adults in their life and strive to offer a place the children and young people can come in times of need. The children and young people have been consulted in the design of the new programme which ensures we are continuing to provide meaningful sessions tailored to their needs. We are always looking to increase our membership and although we are based in Johnstone Castle we are open to children and young people in surrounding areas. This project will allow us to continue to provide sustainable and effective youth work within the area. The children and young people who attend are always keen to use the bouncy castle and like being able to take part in different activities which can only be delivered in the hall. With a new bouncy castle we can continue to offer this along with new sports activities. All children and young people who attend will have times where they can use the bouncy castle as well as the other option of the sports activities and games. The children and young people will continue to be consulted and will be encouraged to be involved in the programme design. They will be able to complete a weekly timetable which will outline the different games that will be played and will encourage them to become more involved in the improvement of their own health and wellbeing. 1.
