(Please use a separate sheet if required)	2.3 2.9	The project provides information and advice to young carers in the Renfrewshire area as well as a network of support services to young people who are carrying out caring responsibilities. This environment provides peer support and creates a sense of belonging. It is an established forum for kids to tackle issues which may be affecting them and the opportunity to be children as often their caring role mitigates the chance of a childhood. We provide one to one support as well as group support. We also provide resources to schools. We sometimes have the opportunity to have social outings which provides a little respite in an often very hectic life. The young carers project was introduced due to a demand to provide a service for a marginalised, vulnerable group of young people. It was identified that young carers, were a hidden population, lacking in non-familial supports, who were socially and emotionally isolated. It was clear that many children in the area were providing care to a relative at home and that their rights were being ignored. Research at that time was limited on the needs of young carers but what quickly became apparent at a local level was that young carers needs were not being wholly met, thus impacting on all areas of their lives. The young carers project was borne out of this need and provided a safe, secure space for young people to come and offload and to be a child! The Young Carers Centre proposes working in partnership with Renfrewshire Leisure to offer a suite of leisure opportunities for young carers to participate in. This will lessen the impact that caring can have on children; will offer activities/leisure pursuits which the young person can look forward to. It will help to create a sense of belonging for the young person, it will promote healthy activity thus positively impacting on physical and mental wellbeing. With the implementation of The Carers (Scotland) Act 2016, there is a duty on the local authority to carry out a Young Carer Statement in partnership with the young person. W

We are inundated with referrals, especially at this time of year having provided almost 200 children with full, brand new school uniforms since 1st May 2018. We rely solely on donations from the public and local business to keep us afloat and really require significant funds at this time to ensure we can continue to fulfil the growing number of referrals that we are receiving. I am a primary teacher in Paisley and myself and colleagues see daily the children who come ill-prepared for school and the impact that this then has on their self esteem, confidence and also most importantly their learning. We decided to set up the uniform bank to service the Paisley area. We contacted local schools and local services to introduce ourselves and very quickly we were receiving referrals from across Renfrewshire. We now provide hundreds of referrals to families across the Renfrewshire Area. This project hopes to alleviate some of the financial pressure that families find themselves in when trying to provide school uniforms for their children. We source and buy new items only so as to ensure that all children feel the same sense of pride and self respect as theirs peers. We hope that with this funding we are able to continue to support the families of Renfrewshire. We would like to reach as many

(Please use a separate sheet if required)	2.3 2.9	The purpose of the project is to involve young people in planning and participating in their own event and encouraging them to lead and deliver this project to other people in the community. Also to create an alternative activity that will allow disengaged young people to get involved with EYC and their future events.  Erskine youth council was previously successful in gaining LAC funding to hold 10 youth friendly events within Erskine. From the success of the events young people have identified the need to continue to hold exciting and new youth friendly events within their area. Erskine youth council have achieved project planning experience holding these events and wish to continue to develop and use these skills to offer new activities and experiences to young people and their community. One of the events that EYC members planned was a team building day at Glasgow Escape rooms for other young people and group members. This inspired young people to want to create their own escape room in their local area to provide a Free event that hasn't been done before and will cater to people of all ages. This event will be known as Erskine Escapes. Depending on the success of this event it may later be delivered to other areas of Renfrewshire.  Erskine Escapes event will be held during the October week holidays to tie in with the Halloween festival, the room will be Halloween themed. This will be a 2-day event. The venue Erskine Escapes will be Bargarran community centre, main hall. Young people will be at the forefront for planning and organising this escape room event and will be delivering the experience to other people with the support of youth services staff. This event will be advertised via social media and community pages along with posters and leaflets that are designed by EYC members. EYC will also be outreaching to other local youth voice groups create stronger partnerships with other young people in their local area.				

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What is your group's current bank balance? Some materials will be transported such as furniture and rented media equipment. There will be two-day event. Each escape room experience will last around one hour long with 15-minute breaks to allow the rooms to be reset. The Escape room will be closed over but will be not be locked and there will be two staff members present in the room to monitor young people young people and their families can book online using Eventbrite. The escape room will be adapted throughout the day to cater for different ages and abilities; there will be children's room (10-12 years old), teenager's room (13-16 years old) and young adult's room (17-25 years old). Slots can also be booked for Youth groups and Families using the youngest members age as the ability (aged 10+ only).
