Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest intimated prior to the commencement of the meeting.

1 Membership of Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterill & Charleston Local Partnership

There was submitted a report by the Chief Executive relative to the appointment of community representatives to vacant positions on the Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterhill & Charleston Local Partnership.

The report advised that in terms of the decision taken at the meeting of the Council held on 27 September 2018 membership of the Local Partnerships would be comprised of an equal number of elected members from Renfrewshire Council and community representatives with the standing members being those elected members which represented wards within the Local Partnership area and representatives of active community councils in the area. The 13 elected members eligible for membership of the Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterhill & Charleston Local Partnership were detailed together with the representatives of the three active Community Councils in the area. As a result, there were currently ten vacancies for community representatives. It was agreed that one of the vacancies not be filled at present to facilitate future youth representation on the Local Partnership.

Details of eight organisations who had, to date, expressed an interest in providing a community representative on the Local Partnership were provided within the report. Criteria to support standing members to come to a decision on the appointment of community representation was also provided.

The report intimated that neither Hunterhill nor Charleston Community Councils were currently active and it was agreed that the Council take appropriate action to encourage the re-establishment of Community Councils in those areas. It was also proposed and agreed that the representative of Hopeful Evangelical Church, Peter Campbell, be appointed, in the interim, to the standing member vacancy reserved for Charleston Community Council to represent the interests of the Charleston area. Furthermore, it was agreed that the remaining applicants be appointed to the Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterhill & Charleston Local Partnership.

DECIDED:

- (a) That the Council take appropriate action to encourage the re-establishment of Community Councils in the Hunterhill and Charleston areas;
- (b) That the representative of Hopeful Evangelical Church, Peter Campbell, be appointed, in the interim, to the standing member vacancy reserved for Charleston Community Council to represent the interests of the Charleston area;
- (c) That one of the existing vacancies on the Local Partnership not be filled at present to facilitate future youth representation; and

(d) That Mary Logan (Charleston Tenants and Residents Association), John McQuade (Renfrewshire Visually Impaired Forum), Nicola Hanssen (ROAR Connections for Life), Piero Pieraccini (Paisley Development Trust), Chris Johnstone (Rainbow Turtle), Elaine Loch (Paisley Opera) and Susan McDonald (Active Communities) be appointed to the Local Partnership.

2 Date of Next Meeting

There then followed discussion regarding factors influencing arrangements for future meetings of the Local Partnership - Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterhill & Charleston.

DECIDED:

- (a) That it be noted that the next meeting of the Local Partnership Paisley East, Ralston, Hawkhead and Lochfield, Hunterhill & Charleston would be held (i) during March 2019; (ii) at a similar time to the former Local Area Committee meetings; and (iii) at a venue to be advised to members as soon as possible; and
- (b) That it be noted that in terms of Local Partnership Standing Order 3.7 the Chair could agree that voting be by roll call vote to help ensure fairness in debate.





As recorded by the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation





SIMD 2016 - Access Deprivation




Access Deprivation

This measure includes drive time to GP, to retail centre, to petrol station, to primary and secondary schools, to post office and public transport time to GP, to retail centre, to post office.




Health Deprivation

This measure includes the Standardised Mortality Ratio; Hospital stays related to alcohol misuse; Hospital stays related to drug misuse; Comparative Illness Factor; Emergency stays in hospital; Proportion of population being prescribed drugs for anxiety, depression or psychosis; and Proportion of live singleton births of low birth weight.

Place Standard, 2017



TITLE:

Local Partnership – Future Arrangements

1. Summary

- 1.1 Paisley East & Whitehaugh, Ralston, Hawkhead & Lochfield, Hunterhill and Charleston Local Partnership requires to take a number of decisions about its operation over the next year.
- 1.2 These decisions relate to the arrangements for meetings and the name the Local Partnership wishes to be known by. Members of the Local Partnership are invited to contribute to these decisions as set out in section 3 below.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that Paisley East & Whitehaugh, Ralston, Hawkhead & Lochfield, Hunterhill and Charleston Local Partnership:
 - (a) Agree that three further meetings of the Local Partnership be held in June 2019, November 2019 and March/April 2020 with a wider community engagement event to take place during September/October 2019, as set out in paragraphs 3.1 3.3.
 - (b) Agree that members of the Local Partnership contribute their views on accessible venues for future meetings, as set out in paragraph 3.4.
 - (c) Agree that members of the Local Partnership contribute suggestions for its name going forward as set out in paragraphs 3.5-3.6, for decision at next meeting on Tuesday 25 June 2019.
 - (d) Note the arrangements for Community Representative expenses, as set out in paragraph 3.7.

3. Background

- 3.1 Local Partnerships will meet a minimum of three times per year. The next meeting of Paisley East & Whitehaugh, Ralston, Hawhhead & Lochfield, Hunterhill and Charleston Local Partnership will take place at 6pm on Tuesday 25 June 2019 in the Marriage Suite, Renfrewshire House.
- 3.2 It is proposed that each Local Partnership sets two further dates to meet in November 2019 and March/April 2020 and that the start time for meetings be agreed as 6pm.
- 3.3 In addition to the three Local Partnership meetings per annum it is proposed that a community event be organised to enable engagement with community groups, voluntary organisations and members of the public who are not members of the Partnership.
- 3.4 Paisley East & Whitehaugh, Ralston, Hawkhead & Lochfield, Hunterhill and Charleston Local Partnership is asked to consider whether it would prefer a single venue for all meetings or to alternate between different venues within the Local Partnership area. Members are asked to send any suggestions for accessible local venues to communityplanning@renfrewshire.gov.uk by Tuesday 7 May 2019.
- 3.5 Each of the seven Local Partnerships consist of groupings of Community Councils. The name currently being used for the Local Partnership is simply a list of the names of each Community Council in the area.
- 3.6 Each Local Partnership may choose its own name, by agreeing either to continue with its current name or changing to an alternative name. Proposals for an alternative name should be submitted to communityplanning@renfrewshire.gov.uk by Tuesday 7 May 2019 for consideration and decision at the meeting of the Local Partnership.
- 3.7 Under the previous Local Area Committee arrangements, community representatives were entitled to £50 per annum expenses to attend meetings. Members of the Local Partnership may continue to claim £50 per annum expenses for attendance at meetings. This resource would be drawn from the Local Partnership grant funding allocation as was the case previously under Local Area Committee arrangements.
